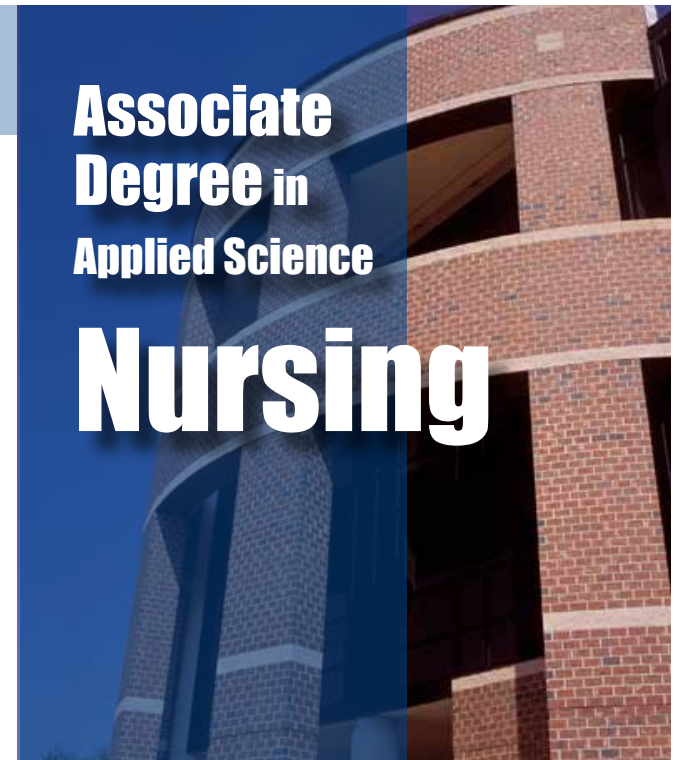

Program Highlights

Spartanburg Community College's Associate Degree in Applied Science - Nursing (ADN) program prepares individuals to be health care providers in a variety of settings. Nurses promote good health and maintenance, curative, restorative, supportive and terminal care while considering the multiple environmental factors in patients' lives.

Students enrolled in the program learn how to treat the whole person by combining nursing principles and theories (including patients' mental and social factors) with the sciences (patients' physical symptoms) to create a holistic approach to patient care. Through the ADN program, students gain interpersonal, comprehensive critical thinking and technical skills through on-campus simulation labs, clinical rotations in affiliated hospitals, physician's offices, clinics, and other health care facilities.

Admission and Curriculum

In order to be considered for the ADN program, students must have a minimum 2.5 grade point average for all required nursing curriculum general education courses. A weighted admission process based on points earned from completed required curriculum general education courses is used to select new students for program entry. The weighted admission criteria sheet and GPA calculator can be found at www.sccsc.edu/nursing. Nursing students with the highest grades and points will be offered a slot within the program.

Approximately 30 qualified candidates are accepted into the program per semester. The ADN program accepts students during fall and spring semesters. This allows flexibility for both traditional and non-traditional students to complete the curriculum and enter the workforce, and provides the community with skilled health care professionals.

Career Opportunities

Upon successful completion of the program, graduates receive an Associate Degree in Applied Science - Nursing and are eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX – RN exam).

Registered nurses have many employment opportunities in diverse health care areas including hospitals, physicians' offices, nursing homes, clinics, private and community agencies, industry, education, military and more.
