What is SCC Student Disability Services and What Do We Offer?



The Student Disability Services Program at Spartanburg Community College ensures equal access to all SCC academic programs and facilities to all qualified students with disabilities. Department staff work with administration, faculty and staff to support students in their endeavors.

Student disability services can arrange academic accommodations for qualified students. We also offer support to faculty, staff and students in the implementation of accommodations.

Documentation

Acceptable documentation for a student with a physical, medical or psychological disability is a written statement from a physician, which includes a diagnosis and explanation of how this disability may affect the student's academic performance.

For learning disabilities, a recent psychological evaluation no more than three-years old is required, along with an explanation of how the disability may affect the student's academic performance. Recommended accommodations are also considered to ensure academic success.



Who Is Eligible?

Currently enrolled SCC students in degree and non-degree programs who have a documented disability may register with student disability services. The College requests that students with disabilities notify student disability services of any special accommodations at least two weeks prior to the beginning of the semester or as early in the semester as possible.

Meeting With A Counselor

After documentation of the disability is received and reviewed, the SCC counselor will meet with the student to discuss academic accommodations. The counselor and the student will jointly develop an accommodation plan and may request input from the faculty regarding course requirements. Strict standards of confidentiality are maintained at all times.

In the Classroom

Each student is encouraged to talk with his or her instructor about the accommodation plan before the semester begins or as early in the semester as possible. This will allow the instructor necessary time to assist the student with academic accommodations if necessary. The student should also maintain regular contact with the counselor from student disability services during the semester to ensure timely response if changes are necessary.
