## The Campus

The Spartanburg Community College (SCC) Cherokee County Campus opened its doors in April 2007. This 62-acre campus is conveniently located near Interstate 85 and downtown Gaffney, providing the citizens of Cherokee and surrounding counties the opportunity to pursue education and training close to home.

SCC's Cherokee County Campus offers many of the core courses students must take to earn an associate degree, diploma or certificate, as well as continuing education training through the college's **Corporate and Community Education Division**.

The campus provides **state-of-the-art facilities** for learning including a 22,000 square foot academic building. The 15,000 square foot SCC Foundation Cherokee Business Training Center houses a 2,000 square foot manufacturing training area and, through a partnership with Freightliner Custom Chassis Corporation, the only recreational vehicle training area in the state.

## Online Classes

Students attending the Cherokee County Campus can also earn college credit from home via online courses offered through **SCCOnline**. **SCCOnline** offers more than 60 online courses and several online degrees including associate degrees in art, management and interpreter training.

# The courses you need to earn your degree!

## High School Students - Best Start Program

Best Start is a dual enrollment program available through Spartanburg Community College that offers high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school. **Best Start** courses are taught by SCC faculty -- all of whom meet the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools credentialing requirements.

## University Transfer

The University Transfer Program offers students the opportunity to complete their first two years of college close to home at a fraction of the cost of larger universities. University Transfer students complete core college requirements including mathematics, English, social sciences, humanities, fine arts and natural sciences that parallel the courses taken during the freshman and sophomore years at a four-year college or university to earn an Associate in Arts or an Associate in Science degree. Students then transfer to a four-year college or university to complete a bachelor's degree.

## Nuclear Energy - Unique Program of Study

*Radiation Protection Technician Program (a partnership with Duke Energy)*

Through a unique partnership with **Duke Energy**, SCC students can train for a career in the high-demand field of nuclear energy. The Associate Degree in Applied Science with a major in Radiation Protection Technology provides the fundamental knowledge and skills needed for a career as a radiation protection technician in a nuclear power facility. The two-year curriculum includes general education courses, nuclear power plant operation courses taught by Institute of Nuclear Power Operation certified Duke Energy instructors, and two paid, hands-on internships at area nuclear power facilities to prepare graduates for immediate employment as a radiation protection technician.

## General Education and Transitional Courses

The Cherokee County Campus offers a full array of general education courses including mathematics, English, social sciences, humanities, fine arts and natural sciences. The Transitional Studies Department also allows students to take prerequisite courses in biology, chemistry, and algebra that may be necessary for acceptance into the College's curriculum programs.

## Continuing Education

SCC's **Corporate and Community Education Division** offers a wide variety of continuing education training for individuals and businesses in Cherokee County. More than 10,000 individuals, businesses and industries are served annually with an emphasis on innovative training approaches, customized training programs, private consultations and professional development opportunities. From **one-day workshops** for individuals to **customized employee training programs** for businesses, SCC's Corporate and Community Education Division provides training for tomorrow's job skills today.
