



## Unique Scholarship Opportunity for Cherokee County Residents

**The Honorable Rufus H. Foster, Jr. KNOW(2) Scholarship Fund** was established by Cherokee KNOW(2) to encourage county residents to continue their education for at least

two years beyond high school. This fund covers any tuition amount remaining after all other funding and financial aid options have been exhausted, except loans. Because SCC's tuition is the lowest in the region, students can potentially attend college cost-free by taking advantage of financial aid, grants and scholarship opportunities.

### Eligibility Criteria for the KNOW(2) Scholarship:

- Individuals who have received a high school diploma or GED within the past 5 years and have lived in Cherokee County for the last 12 consecutive months or longer
- Veterans who have lived in Cherokee County for the last 12 consecutive months or longer, who have a high school diploma or GED
- Students must enroll in one of the following industrial programs:
  - Automated Manufacturing Technology/Robotics
  - Automotive/Manufacturing Production Technology
  - Electronics Engineering Technologies
  - Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC)
  - Industrial Electricity and Electronics Repair
  - Machine Tool Technology (CNC)
  - Mechanical/Mechatronics
  - Welding

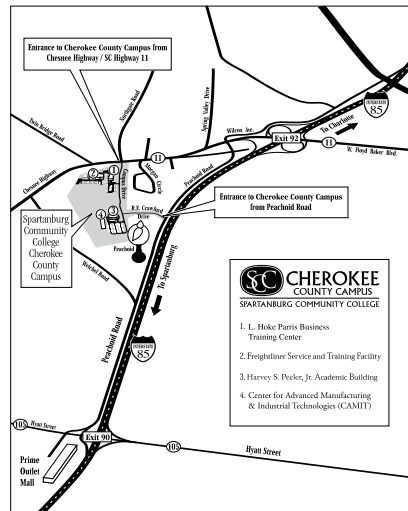
## Corporate & Community Education

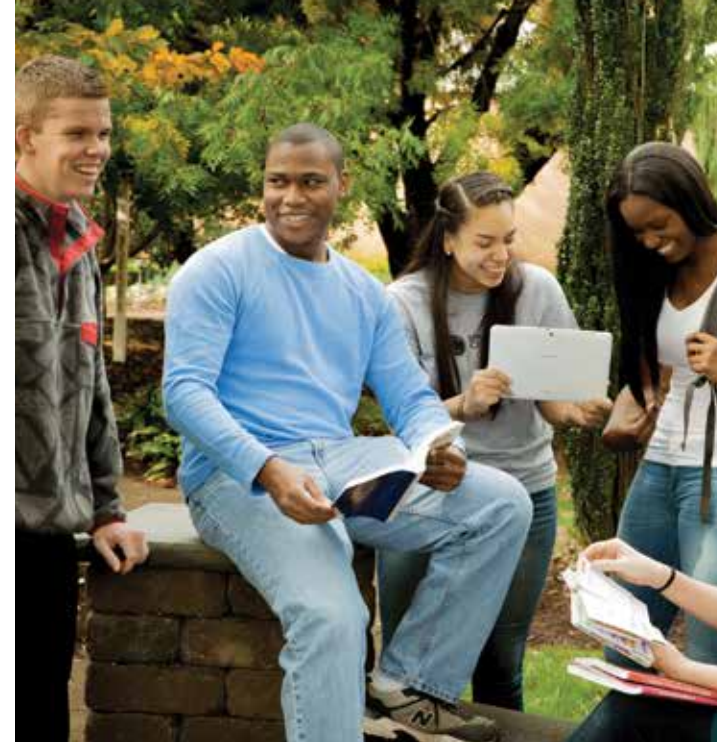

Spartanburg Community College is proud to serve Upstate residents, business and industry in Gaffney and surrounding counties through the Cherokee County Campus. Established in April 2003 and opened in 2007, the SCC Cherokee County Campus provides opportunities for local citizens to pursue education and training close to home by offering courses needed to earn an associate degree, diploma or certificate, as well as SCC Corporate & Community Education classes for personal development and workforce training.

The campus includes state-of-the-art facilities conveniently located on 74-acres near Interstate 85, Highway 11 and downtown Gaffney. Known for caring faculty, staff and a supportive community, the Cherokee County Campus offers small class sizes, flexible schedules and a high-tech library facility. Students can take a full array of general education courses, as well as transitional studies classes that may be necessary for acceptance into SCC's curriculum programs.

## Convenience and Ease of Transfer

Academic offerings include a variety of credit courses in flexible and convenient formats that include classes during the day, evening, on weekends or online. Classes are available in the traditional 15-week semester, as well as 10-week, 7.5 week and 5.5 week formats through SCC's FlexStart terms.
